## Letter from the Executive Director

Members of AIA East Tennessee,

I knew from the age of five or so that I wanted to become an architect, ever since someone in my class told me I could make money doing what I did all the time anyway – drawing buildings. 





#### **MEMBERSHIP BY TYPE**




#### MEMBERSHIP BY RACE/ETHNICITY




## 2024 AIA ETN Membership Statistics




## 2024 Committees




